

We often see that a difference in planting date of about four weeks results in a difference in pod maturity of about 10 days. The following images are from a planting date study at Lewiston-Woodville. Maturity was determined on September 5 and peanuts were planted May 5 or May 30. Peanuts planted earlier often emerge at a slower rate and grow at a slower pace in May compared with peanuts that are planted in late May or earlier June. The difference in maturity of peanuts in the following images is about 10 days. The difference in planting date was 25 days.
